### Curriculum

#### **Key Stage 3**

At KS3, a broad and balanced curriculum which follows the National Curriculum is provided. Students follow a programme of study which includes English, Maths, Science, History, Geography, Religious Education, Computer Science, Modern Foreign Languages including French and Arabic, Art, Design and Technology and PE. The KS3 curriculum develops students' knowledge, skills and understanding in each of these subjects and prepares them for KS4.

#### **Key Stage 4**

All students study the core curriculum which includes English Language, English Literature, Mathematics, Science, Religious Education, Life Skills (no qualification) and PE (no qualification). A wide range of optional subjects are on offer to allow students to pursue their interests and give them a strong foundation for the future. Students at Madani are encouraged to pursue

the English Baccalaureate (EBacc) pathway consisting of English Language, Maths, the Sciences, Modern Foreign Languages and History/Geography.

#### Oracy

Oracy is the ability to articulate ideas, develop understanding and engage with others through spoken language. In school, Oracy is a powerful tool for learning; by teaching students to become more effective speakers and listeners we empower them to better understand themselves, each other, and the world around them.

At Madani, Oracy is a key teaching and learning tool to support students to access the knowledge and skills required to be able to progress in each subject. We teach students to learn through talk and to learn to talk to support their progress towards direct outcomes like GCSEs but also more widely so that they are prepared for life beyond school.

Noor Inayat Khan was the first British Muslim spy in World War II who served in the Special Operations Executive.

Noor Inayat Khan was Born on New Year's Day in 1914 in Moscow and of dual heritage. She was educated in Paris and was awarded a Blue Plaque award in August 2020.

Noor Inayat Khan was known as a woman who would not stop at anything to secure safety of the world. She displayed a great amount of resilience in all aspects of her life.



#### House Malala Yousafzai

Malala reminds us the importance of education despite the circumstances. She also displays courage in standing up for what is right.




#### House Fatima Al-Fihri

"To acquire knowledge one must study, but to acquire wisdom one must observe."

Fatima al-Fihri was a Muslim woman from Tunisia who founded the first known university more than 1,000 years ago: The University of al-Qarawiyyin in Fez, Morocco. Guinness World Records acknowledges it as the oldest existing and continually operating educational institution in the world.
